Evelyn Long Inducted into the RVWBA Hall of Fame

Evelyn Long, this year's inductee into the RVWBA Hall of Fame for Meritorious Service has been a member of WIBC, VSWBA and RVWBA for 32 years.

In the fall of 1970, Evelyn who was responsible for the Courvette Duckpin League, played a major roll in having it converted to the Courvette Tenpin League. As an employee of the Roanoke City Department of Parks and Recreation she convinced the department to sponsor teams from the four Recreation Centers. She served as Vice President and President of the Courvette League and bowled many years in the Vikette League at Viking Lanes where she served as an officer and on various committee's.

Evelyn was appointed to the RVWBA Board as a Director in '77-78 to fill the vacancy of Director #5 and then was re-elected to that position for five 3 year terms, retiring at the end of the '93-94 season. She served as Chairman of the Awards & Patches Committee from '77-78 until her retirement. In that roll, she received all the applications for the awards, ordered them and then delivered them to the bowlers, also keeping records to avoid duplication. She served on the Annual Meeting Committee for 10 years – most of those years Board members were preparing the food for the Annual Meeting! The year that stands out the most to Evelyn was the year she was responsible for deviling 100 eggs. It's said, to this day she still likes deviled eggs!

Evelyn also served on Audit, Excuses, Minute Review, Report to Delegates, Herm Bules (Blind Bowlers), BVL, Workshop, Publicity and Senior Committee's, while also serving as a Lane Rep. at Viking Lanes.

For our local and state tournaments, when we hosted them, Evelyn was known as the Scorekeeper Lady, <u>before computers</u>. She worked many hours lining up scorekeepers, following up to make sure they didn't forget their assignments and kept an updated list of all score keepers. She also served on the Duffers Tournament, the Trophies and Recap Committee's.

Evelyn attended at least two State Workshops and was a delegate to at least two VSWBA Annual Meetings. In the 1993 VSWBA Seniors Tournament Evelyn won 1st Place in the Division 'B' Singles.

Evelyn was elected a Member Emeriti of the RVWBA in 1994.

Evelyn has a son, Michael, who is a minister, daughter-in-law, Laura, an Emergency Room R.N. and two grandsons, Benjamin and Gregory. They live in Enosburg, VT.

The following was taken in part from the 2002 Feb. issue of 'Satellite Orbit' and "American Bowler".

If you think nobody (well, very few people that is) watches bowling on TV, think again. Televised bowling, which started in 1961 on ABC, is becoming more popular. In fact, TV viewing ratings for some PBA [Professional Bowling Association] telecasts shown on ESPN have been higher than some NHL hockey telecasts.

Bigger multi-lane centers are the trend. Bowling is growing in popularity but not in the number of bowling centers but in the number of lanes at centers. In the 2000-2001 season, the ABC and WIBC certified 6,309 bowling centers and 128,836 lanes. The average American bowling center has grown to to nearly 20.5 lanes.

Interest in league bowling seems to be slipping but interest in bowling is increasing.
